Currently, UFAAS reaches out to over 1,000 actors ranging from both public, private and media actors offering extension to Ugandan communities. It is a Non-State Actor (NSA) that closely works with MAAIF, plus other development partners and AEAS actors. It promotes strategic partnerships, capacity building, networking and information sharing, advocacy and professional interaction among actors towards the vision of "Professional AEAS effectively driving the agricultural revolution in Uganda".
